B) U.S. Educators to Japan ("USEJ") Program

USEJ program started in 1975 and has been providing Southern California teachers and school administrators with an opportunity to visit Japan and mainly to learn about Japanese Educational Systems and its culture. The participants returned with personal insights and more knowledge about Japanese educational systems and culture to teach and understand Japanese students enrolled in their schools. Since its inception, the program has offered this experience to over approximately 560 educators.

Due to the ongoing global pandemic, we are currently planning an alternative program where educators can learn and share a mutual understanding of Japanese culture.



COVID-19-Related Points to Consider

A. Protocol

- JBA will hold this Charity Golf Tournament by following CDC/ CA State Guidelines as well as Tustin Ranch Golf Club's COVID-19 Procedures. Please make sure to review beforehand.

- Along with the above, unvaccinated guests are asked to wear masks inside the clubhouse/clubhouse area. Golf carts are double rider access.

B. Guests will be asked to sign "RELEASE OF LIABILITY AND ASSUMPTION OF RISK" at the registration table on the event day.

- Please review the form beforehand. (We will prepare the forms to sign at the registration table.)

C. Award Ceremony

- In order to minimize the risk of infection, we are planning an outdoor reception with a maximum capacity of 120~150 people.
 Buffet style meal will be served by designated clubhouse servers to minimize the communal sharing of tongs/utensils.
- The award ceremony will start after play at 3:00PM, duration is roughly 90 minutes. Tent set-up is planned to take measures against weather; however, since the temperature will be chilly towards the evening, please make sure to bring jackets and outerwear.

D. Logistics of donation items

- Normally, we ask for donated items to be directed to the JBA
 Office, but due to the ongoing COVID-19 situation, there is a
 possibility that we may ask you to ship your items to an alternate
 facility.
